Award Winning Guitarist John Jorgenson to Perform January 10

Three time guitarist of the year, John Jorgenson, will perform in Ellijay, Saturday, January 10 at 7:30 pm. The John Jorgenson Quintet specializes in gypsy jazz.

"It combines so many different elements from other styles that I like," says Jorgenson. "It has the drama and virtuosity of classical music. It has the freedom and improvisation of jazz. It has the high energy of rock. It's a very joyful, energetic and challenging music."

Born in Madison in 1956 to musical parents, Jorgenson grew up first playing piano and clarinet in southern California. By age 12, Jorgenson taught himself to play the guitar by listening to bands such as The Beatles, The Byrds, The

Rolling Stones and Creedence Clearwater Revival.

In 1988, John Jorgenson was playing guitar with the Desert Rose Band at the famous Roxy Theatre in Los Angeles. Elton John highlighted a throng of celebrities in the audience. He later called and asked John to tour with him.

Elton John wasn't the first or last superstar Jorgenson backed up. A partial list includes Sting, Billy Joel, Don Henley, Willie Nelson, Bob Seger, Johnny Cash, Lyle Lovett, Tanya Tucker and Luciano Pavarotti. Jorgenson appears on Brad Paisley's new album *Play*.

Jorgenson is happiest playing with his jazz quintet, he said. "I've been doing this pretty

much full time for almost five years now," he said. "I'm pretty satisfied."

Stig Rossen, Danish *Phantom of the Opera*, Performs Valentine's Day



Gilmer Arts and Heritage Association has a very special Valentine's evening planned! On Saturday, February 14 at 7:30 pm, Stig Rossen will be performing as part of our ongoing B.E.S.T. concert series at Ellijay Elementary School.

Stig Rossen is a world-renowned actor and vocalist who first came to fame

when he assumed the lead role of Jean Valjean in the musical *Les Misérables*.

He trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and in 1990 did an open audition for the London production of *Les Misérables*. He was offered a place in the ensemble, and after just three months, was asked to take over the lead role of Jean Valjean. This dream part gave him his international breakthrough, and to this day he has played the part almost 1500 times in 10 different countries.

Stig has recorded a number of albums, including *Starry Starry Nights*, *The Impossible Dream*, *Live In Concert*, *Letters of Love*, *Julelys*, *Stories*,

Love Changes Everything, *This is the Moment*, and *When You Wish upon a Star*.

In Denmark, Stig has appeared in numerous musicals including *Torden-skiold*, *Les Misérables*, *Chess*, *Ballads of Art and Love*, *Jesus Christ Superstar* and *The Colour of Love*.

Apart from his work in the musical theatre, his career spans from concert tours to TV parts. He has voiced Disney characters in the animated features *Mulan*, *Mulan 2* and *Lilo & Stitch*. Furthermore, he has recorded the Danish versions of the songs from *Tarzan*, *Tarzan 2*, and *Brother Bear*.

Stig Rossen published his biography, *Life Should*

Not be Lived on Automatic Pilot in October 2006 which draws on personal experience from his life and career.

With a powerful yet eloquent voice, Stig Rossen's musical virtuosity spans many genres, including musical theater, popular music, gospel, and timeless standards. Please join us on February 14 for a concert to remember!

Beginner Acoustic Guitar

Yes, guitar enthusiasts, he's back! Jim Pittman teaches guitar only once a year at GAHA. He's been doing it for three years now, and it's become one popular class.

People tend to sign up early for classes with this accomplished lead and rhythm guitar player.

Pittman, a sixth generation Georgia native, has been performing with and teaching the guitar for over thirty years. His guitar workshops have become a staple of several music festivals, and he regularly performs with Barefoot Creek, known for its early Grand Ole Opry style music.

Join Jim for the Beginner Acoustic Guitar class for adults. It is not necessary to know how to read music. The six weekly classes start Tuesday, January 13, 2009, from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm and run through February 17. The fee is \$80 for the six classes.

Figurative Sculpture

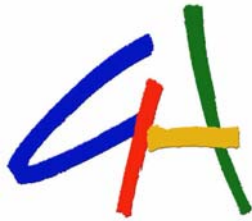
